partnerships with community, service agencies and government departments.

This committee is made up of many community organisations working to support our community.

One of these organisations is Gurudwara Baba Budha sahib ji Pakenham, which is producing and delivering freshly cooked meals to

older people, families in self isolation, international students, temporary visa holders and anyone else in need. They are also providing people with raw ingredients such as rice, wheat, lentils and flour.

Our Community and Business Support Package features a range of initiatives to support our community through the COVID-19 pandemic and beyond.

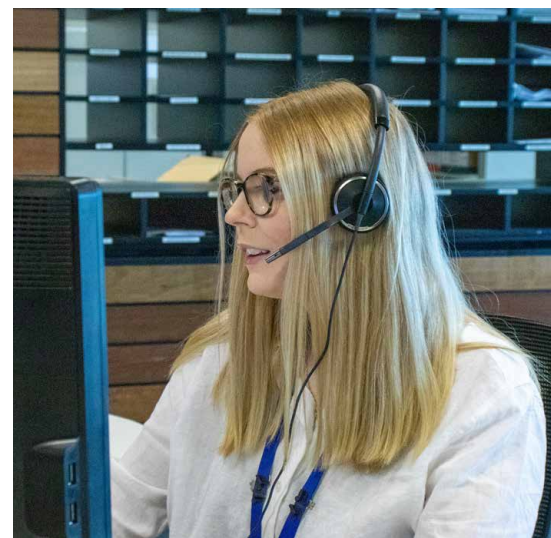

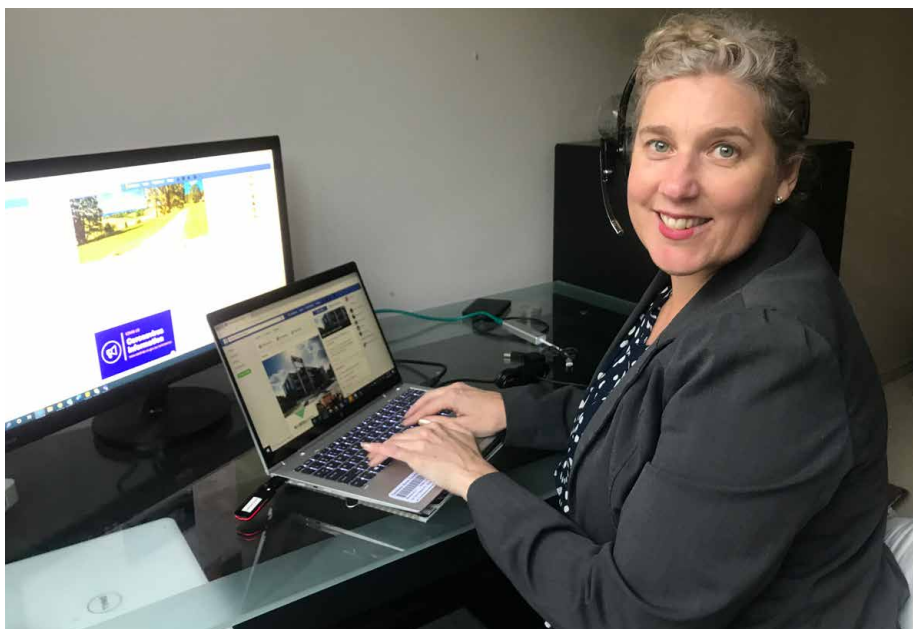

Seeking a smarter solution

Cardinia Shire Council and 15 other councils from south-east Melbourne have begun the first collective tender for advanced waste processing solutions.

The initiative is being driven by the South East Melbourne Advanced Waste Processing Working Group and will give us the ability to process household rubbish that would otherwise have gone to landfill. It is the biggest tender for new waste management infrastructure ever undertaken by councils in Melbourne.

The tender has started with an expression of interest to identify businesses with the right experience and capability to design, build and operate a facility. It will take another two years before a preferred bid is selected and five–six years before a facility is operating. No decisions have been made regarding the type or location of any facilities.

Local businesses: switch on savings

Did you know that business owners in Cardinia Shire can apply for finance for energy, water and waste efficient projects to help significantly reduce their operating costs and impact on the environment?

The Environmental Upgrade Finance (EUF) program is a Sustainable Melbourne Fund project that:

- offers long-term, low interest loans via an agreement to owners of eligible commercial and non-residential buildings

- supports businesses to upgrade their infrastructure to increase energy, water and waste efficiency
- offers repayment terms of up to 20 years to help reduce repayment amounts
- offers 100% project finance
- has fixed quarterly repayments made via Council rates
- allows repayments to be split between landlords and tenants.

Community spirit hard at work

In the 16 months since the Bunyip Complex Fires, we have continued to work with and support our fire-affected communities and businesses with the help of many community organisations and volunteers.

Here's a snapshot of some of the support that has been provided:

- 2,200 lunches and dinners served
- 1,500 hours undertaken by SES volunteers to clean up properties
- 600 BlazeAid volunteers clearing 300 kilometres of burnt fencing and replacing 150 kilometres of fencing
- 284 essential water deliveries
- 80 businesses supported
- 80 volunteers assisting the Bushfire Recovery Centre
- 50 properties made safe with tree works
- 30 volunteer groups supporting the recovery
- 20 wellbeing activities and workshops held
- 10 Community Recovery Committee members advocating for community needs.

Council would like to thank all volunteers for the important role they have played in helping our community recover. We will continue to support our community and connect community members and businesses with services and assistance.

Artists aid recovery

Creative Recovery Network and Cardinia Shire Council have appointed three local artists to participate in a new bushfire recovery program designed to support community recovery and resilience building.

The program is in response to the Bunyip Complex Fires in 2019 and is a region-wide partnership between Creative Recovery Network and Cardinia Shire, Baw Baw Shire and Latrobe City councils with support from Lifeline Gippsland and funding from the Victorian Government.

The program is designed to build capacity among local artists to develop recovery programs in disaster-affected communities, as well as foster a sense of communal recovery through unique creative projects. Three artists from each local government area have been appointed.

Be prepared

Prepare your property ahead of the fire danger period by:

- cutting grass and removing fallen branches within 30 metres of buildings
- removing leaves and twigs from gutters
- cutting back trees and shrubs overhanging buildings
- writing down and practising your fire action plan
- ensuring your home and contents insurance is adequate.

If you plan on burning off as part of your clean up, you must do this before the fire danger period, which is set by the CFA each year. A permit may be required.

Work is also nearing completion on the bridge at the southern end of the reserve. The new bridge will provide better access from the end of Possum

Place on the eastern side of the creek and Victory Drive on the western side.

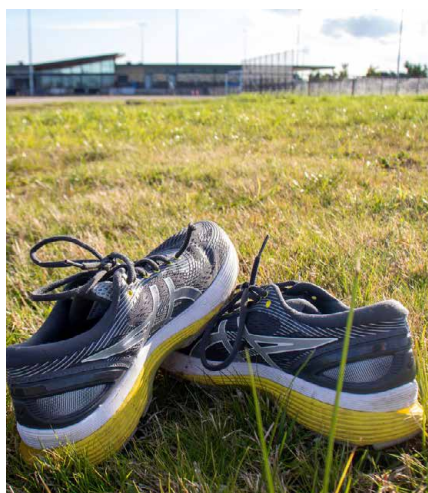


Planning for regional athletics facility

Win for local sports

Cr Michael Schilling, Cr Collin Ross and Cr Carol Ryan are looking forward to the improvements to the pavilions at Toomuc Recreation Reserve.

Local sporting clubs and the wider community are set to benefit from the planned redevelopment of the three pavilions at Toomuc Recreation Reserve in Pakenham.

We are working closely with user groups on the concept for the northern pavilion project and southern pavilion project. The improvements

will accommodate growing participation in local sports and will ensure all ages and genders will have equal and safe use of the facilities.

Upgrades are expected to include universally accessible change rooms and amenities for players and umpires, as well as improvements to

existing facilities such as canteens, social spaces and spectator areas.

Local clubs to benefit from the improvements include Pakenham Football Club, Pakenham Lions Netball Club, Pakenham Cricket Club, Pakenham Junior Football Club, Pakenham Pumas Baseball Club, and Pakenham Little Athletics Centre.



Play time in Devine Drive

A new playground featuring a gyro spinner, triple swing set, two-person rocker, slides and a track ride is now open in Devine Drive, Pakenham.

New planting is being established so some areas around the playground remain fenced.

We thank the community members who provided valuable input and feedback into the project as part of the community consultation process.

The project was undertaken as part of our 2019–20 Capital Works Program.

Kicking goals in Bunyip

Construction of the new soccer pavilion at Bunyip Recreation Reserve is now complete.

The new pavilion features universally accessible change rooms and amenities for players and umpires, a first aid room, kitchen/canteen, multi-purpose room for club activities and community hire, cleaners' storage room, and storage spaces.

Detailed design for the redevelopment of the two soccer fields with a cricket pitch is now underway in consultation with the local clubs and reserve committee.

The pavilion will be home to Bunyip Strikers Soccer Club and will ensure the club can accommodate the growing local participation in soccer, including junior and female players.

The building will also be available for other local clubs that use the reserve, including the Bunyip Cricket Club.

The project was jointly funded by Council and the Australian Government's Building Better Regions Fund.

Recreation and community precinct for Lang Lang



The major recreation and community precinct at Lang Lang is now complete.

Lang Lang Community Recreation Reserve features ovals for Australian Rules Football and cricket, netball courts, cricket practice nets, a pavilion with multipurpose community

space, a wetland area and other open spaces for recreational activities.

The project has been jointly funded by Council, Our Community Company, the franchiser of Lang Lang Community Bank, and the Australian Government's Building Better Regions Fund.

Adventure awaits at Nar Nar Goon Recreation Reserve's newly upgraded playground.

We've worked closely with the community to create a play space that caters for children of all ages. It features a quad swing, basket swing, two person rocker, climbing cube, monkey bars and slides.

The new district play space at Dick Jones Park in Lang Lang is also nearing completion. It features a flying fox, triple swing set, tornado swing, slides including two large tunnel slides, rock climbing walls,

a climbing cube and a dedicated toddler zone. The playground will be a great spot to play in the warmer months with plenty of natural and built shade provided.

Road safety improvements

Four kilometres of guardrail has been installed on both sides of Main Drain South Road in Bunyip.

The guardrail has been installed between Evans Road and Little Road and will help improve road safety.

Council received a grant from the Australian Government's Blackspot Program to undertake the \$500,000 project.



Accessibility upgrades

Garfield outdoor pool has been upgraded to improve access for all.

Improvements included:

- installing a moveable hoist for the pool
- accessible change room upgrade
- levelling pathways around the pool area
- modifications to the entrance and exit gates
- accessible car parking spaces.

Council received funding for the accessibility upgrades from Sport Australia's Community Sport Infrastructure program.

The Perc Allison pavilion at Beaconsfield Recreation Reserve is getting a major upgrade.

Works will include unisex and universally accessible change rooms for players and umpires, a first aid and injury prevention/strapping room, a gym and covered spectator viewing area. Detailed design is now complete and the tender process is underway.

With increased female participation in organised sport, this project will ensure all ages and genders have equal and safe use of the facility.

This project is valued at more than \$630,000, with the Australian Government's Sport Australia Fund contributing \$500,000.

Gearing up for better local roads

Council is progressing its Better Local Roads Program to modernise and improve 111km of unsealed roads.

The Australian Government has committed \$150 million in funding, to be provided in stages over 10 years starting later this year. The funding will be used to seal priority roads

in the hills and to help subsidise residential contributions to special charge schemes.

The project will help more than 3,400 families and residents in Cardinia Shire to get their roads sealed. Residents of roads subject to a special charge scheme will have an

opportunity to share their feedback and decide if they would like to have their road sealed. Works on the first road upgrades are scheduled to start this summer.

Works start at Gembrook Recreation Reserve

Works to redevelop the sporting pavilion at Gembrook Recreation Reserve have started.

The pavilion will feature unisex and universally accessible change rooms for players and umpires, accessible amenities, a first aid room, gym, storage, minor upgrade to the existing kitchen and social room, upgrade to the spectator viewing lounge and timekeeper's room, and lift access to the first floor.

The project is jointly funded by Council (\$1.45 million) and the Australian Government's Community

Development Program (\$1 million). Works are expected to be completed in early 2021.

The pavilion will complement the recently completed redevelopment of the two netball courts. Funded by Council, this project included new acrylic surfacing, fencing, court lighting and players' boxes.

viewing area and a ground level not-for-profit community gym.

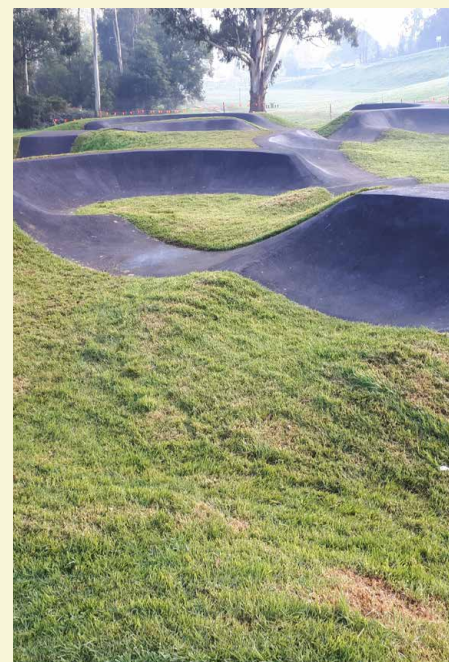
Stage 2 of the oval redevelopment is also complete and included an upgrade to the sports field lighting, new coaches' boxes and a high ball net.

- You can dispose of up to two cubic meters (2m x 1m x 1m) for each collection. This is the same amount as the previous service.
- If you can't reuse it, sell it or give it away, book your hard waste collection online or by phone and we will pick it up.
- To help keep our streets tidy and safe, please remember that hard waste should be placed on your nature strip no earlier than the weekend before your booked collection date.
