

Here's some to get you started...

Lang Lang Beach

A small little section of Western Port Bay in Cardinia Shire provides access to Lang Lang beach and foreshore. The whole of Western Port is protected under the Ramsar convention, due to the international significance of the flora and diverse fauna that make the intertidal mudflats their home. A great place for a beach stroll or a spot of fishing.

Sutherland Park Recreation Reserve

A natural bushland area, nestled between Sutherland Rd, Stoney Creek Rd and Rosebank Lane in Upper Beaconsfield. The reserve includes a playground, picnic areas and walking trails and is also home to Upper Beaconsfield Tennis Club.

Garfield Recreation Reserve

If you love a nostalgically old-school outdoor pool in garden surrounds, Garfield Recreation Reserve (2 Beswick St, Garfield) might be just the ticket. The 33-metre main pool, smaller 10-metre pool and wading pool close for the season on 20 March. The reserve is also home to cricket nets, a skate park, football oval, tennis courts, netball courts and a playground.





Eastone Reserve

Well-loved by local residents, this wetland reserve off Windermere Blvd in Pakenham, is home to plenty of wildlife and is a popular spot for on-leash dog walking. Take a picnic to relax by the water or work up a sweat running the stairs and using the outdoor exercise stations located around the perimeter of the lake. View the whole wetland system from the scenic lookout.

So many options in Gembrook

Gembrook is a great destination offering many recreational options all within cooee of each other. Take a quiet bush walk along the narrow, natural trails in Gembrook Park to enjoy the stillness of a dense tree fern gully, or take the children to nearby Redwood Road Reserve, a natural playground set back from the road providing a safe and creative area for children to play.



Just up the road is Gembrook Leisure Park which was recently upgraded and includes a flying fox, giant climbing pyramid, trampoline and wheelchair friendly merry-go-round. Plus, of course, the active zone and skate park make a great stop off for older kids and teens.



Harrison Way Reserve

This reserve on Harrison Way Pakenham is a great little park located in the Grandvue Estate offering barbecues, shelter and playspace with a large slide. The reserve also has lovely open space for games or picnicking.





Officer Community Hub

With 3 courts available for hire, this facility offers opportunities for games of basketball, volleyball and even futsal. You can also hire a fully equipped multipurpose room for your next meeting or conference. The community hub's cafe is a great place to meet for a coffee or relax after the big game. Contact Cardinia Leisure to book any part of this facility.

Don Jackson Reserve

A place to take the dogs to enjoy some off-leash exercise in a fully fenced area. This reserve (entry off Ahern Road, Pakenham) is a gem – offering something for everyone; drinking fountains, agility equipment, a football oval, and a playground with shade sails for visiting any time of year.





Edenbrook Wetlands and Playground

Edenbrook Reserve in Pakenham is nestled at the southern end of Toomuc Creek. This reserve offers visitors a view over wetlands, and opportunity to enjoy the bird life, including resident ducks and swans. A small playground is located in a natural setting with connecting paths to different play elements.

Citizen of the Year - Philip Anning

Philip is a strong advocate for the advancement of community sport and junior sport development. As president of the Pakenham Cricket Club, he ensures the club fosters an inclusive competition to enable families to participate and to create a positive environment. He has tirelessly fundraised for the McGrath Foundation;



the club's annual Pink Ladies Day luncheon raised more than \$30,000. Philip is a strong supporter of local businesses and encourages others to do the same. Philip is described as an 'icon' in Pakenham with friends far and wide who deserves to be recognised for the inspiring man he is.

Citizen of the Year - Carol Thompson

Carol has a long history of volunteering and has dedicated many hours to the Cockatoo RSL. She joined the committee as secretary and treasurer in 2015 and has also been bar and events manager. Carol has worked tirelessly with committee members to increase patronage and turnover. In addition to running the traditional



Anzac Day and Remembrance Day events, Carol has been instrumental in establishing regular social events at the RSL, including the annual free Christmas day lunch, pool and Uno competitions, trivia nights, karaoke and live music. Due to her ongoing dedication and contributions, Carol was nominated RSL President of the Year. Since she and her family moved to Cockatoo in 1998, Carol has also been involved in Cockatoo Community Creche and Cockatoo Country Market and has supported young people in need.



Senior Citizen of the Year - Ian Wake

An active Rotarian for 50 years, lan has held a range of club leadership positions and is the first to lend a helping hand for community projects, barbecues and working bees. lan has been involved in the development of Rotary Park, where he has initiated planting



native trees and shrubs and been involved in projects such as the construction of shelters, seating, the toilet block and other amenities. He has run 'old time' community dances since 2007, raising more than \$150,000 for Rotary Club of Pakenham projects. Ian chartered 2 Interact and 2 Rotaract clubs and has also been involved in the Beaconsfield Scout Group and Church of Christ Berwick.

Young Citizen of the Year - Arshu Maskey

Arshu is committed to making a difference in people's lives. During secondary school she was elected Community Service Representative leader for 2 consecutive years, organising blood donation drives, raising funds and facilitating a coin race to bring the community together. Arshu hosted a Multicultural



International Mother's Language Day event and, as a member of the Casey Cardinia Rotaract Club, she raised funds for bushfire relief efforts and supported a fundraising barbecue to raise money for the club. At university Arshu is mentoring students as part of a Woman in Technology program. Arshu continues to make a difference by helping, inspiring and empowering others.

Community Event of the Year - Cockatoo Country Market

The Cockatoo Country Market adapted to virtual markets during COVID-19 lockdowns but organisers were excited to host the March 2021 Twilight Market in person. It was the most successful yet, with more than 2,500 people attending the event. The market provides a low-cost and low-risk platform for micro, home-based and artisan traders, with free advertising and profile building for stallholders. The market also provides opportunities for local community groups to fundraise and attract new volunteers and participants for their programs. A community barbecue is provided for community groups each month, adding to the fundraising and networking opportunities. Now in its 7th year, the market contributes to the ongoing support and development of community organisations via its community grants program, which has awarded more than \$22,000 to local groups for a variety of projects.





Developing our sporting facilities

Upper Beaconsfield BMX

Upgrades to Upper Beaconsfield BMX track are rolling ahead. The new park will feature:

- two key starting platforms accessed from the car park
- an asphalt pump track designed to connect with the existing dirt track
- resting and viewing platforms
- berms, roller, step down/up double roller, and rollable hipped tabletop.

Koo Wee Rup skate park upgrade

After an extensive consultation with our community, Cochrane Park skate park in Koo Wee Rup will be upgraded to provide skaters, scooters and BMX riders with a uniquely designed and family friendly skate park. Surrounding facilities include picnic areas, barbecues, playground, toilets and tennis courts.



Toomuc Recreation Reserve

The sporting precinct at Toomuc Recreation Reserve is being improved. The netball courts are being resurfaced and the northern pavilion's ground floor and balcony is being extended. The existing southern pavilion is being renovated, including extending the change rooms and amenities.

The kitchen in the little athletics building is also being renovated and portable facilities for baseball will be installed. This project is jointly funded by the Australian Government,



Bunyip soccer and cricket field

Two new soccer pitches with a cricket wicket will be built at Bunyip Reserve, complementing the recently finished pavilion. The grounds are used by the Bunyip Strikers Soccer Club and other local clubs including Bunyip Cricket Club. Funded by Council and the Victorian Government.

Athletics at IYU Reserve, Pakenham

A new regional athletics facility at IYU Recreation Reserve will feature a 400-metre athletics track with a 10-lane straight, long/triple jump facilities as well as pole vault, high jump, javelin, shot put, hammer/discus and steeplechase. Construction of the new track and outdoor infrastructure has begun and planning for a future pavilion is underway. *Funded by Council.*

Catani cricket nets

Catani's new cricket nets at the Catani Recreation Reserve are ready to 'bat and bowl' for the community. The facility features 4 cricket practice bays, new fencing and synthetic carpet. Funded by Council and the Victorian Government.



And for our community...

Wetland Wonders, Deep Creek, Pakenham



As part of Deep Creek Reserve's focus on environmental sustainability, we've established a demonstration wetland that collects runoff from the car park and gives visitors the opportunity to learn how a wetland functions and how it benefits the health of our waterways and Westernport Bay.

Our new Wetland Wonders project leads you to a central platform, even closer to the wetlands, via 3 new trails that represent the 3 creeks merging at the site.

The meandering trails feature educational interpretive signage and interactive 3D models focusing on water bugs and insects, frogs, water birds and the water catchment, and providing information on its importance to the Bunurong people.

The boardwalk is funded by Council and the Victorian Government (DELWP).

Changing Places, Cardinia Life

A new 'Changing Places' fully accessible public toilet has been located in Cardinia Life. The facility features a full-sized change table, ceiling hoist, peninsula-style toilet and shower. Supported by Council's Access and Inclusion Advisory Committee, the new facility helps create a more accessible and inclusive community for all.

Toomuc Valley Road footpath

Works are set to commence on one kilometre of crushed rock path with fencing and drainage on the west side of Toomuc Valley Road. The path begins opposite Pomegranate Way and extends to Brown Road. This project is funded by the Victorian Government's Growing Suburbs Fund.

Worrell Reserve car park

Works are underway to seal the car park and internal road at Worrell Reserve. The works will provide a safer link between the reserve, the Hills Hub, tennis facilities and the Emerald library and formalise more areas for car parking.

Heatherbrae Recreation Reserve bridge

A new 20-metre pedestrian bridge will be constructed over Gum Scrub Creek and form part of the footpath link from Beaconsfield to Pakenham. This project is jointly funded by Council and the Victorian Government's Growing Suburbs Fund.

New Youth Hub breaks ground

The first sod has been turned in the construction of a brand-new youth centre at James Street Pakenham.

Named 'Cardinia Youth Hub', the centre will boast a roof-top recreation space, a recording booth, dedicated training rooms, counselling rooms, a program or group room, computers, and a shower and laundry facility.

Young people will be supported to build resilience, re-engage in education, build relationships with peers and trusted adults and access a range of specialist youth services.

Cardinia Youth Hub is a project between Council, the Victorian Government and the Australian Government.

Strategic sealed roads

The \$25 million Strategic sealed roads project is underway, with latest works to start on McGregor-Soldiers-Hobsons Roads, Pakenham/Rythdale. These works include pavement, kerb and channel and underground drainage works.

LL Road and Armytage Road (from LL Road to Brown Road), Officer, are scheduled for sealing and will include pavement, kerb and channel and underground drainage works. Works are funded by Council.



Sealing the hills

The Sealing the hills project will deliver more than 100 kilometres of sealed roads across the Dandenong Ranges and is being delivered as a series of individual projects on 164 prioritised roads.

Work has started at Princess Avenue and Crichton Avenue, Emerald, and a number of roads through Cockatoo, Gembrook, and Upper Beaconsfield are expected to begin soon.

Works are funded by the Australian Government, and through special charge schemes.

Rubber for roads

More than 56 million tyres reach their end-of-life in Australia each year. With a grant from the Tyre Stewardship Australia, Council is using a crumb rubber modified asphalt mix in the road sealing project at Princes Avenue and Crichton Road, Emerald.

The crumb rubber asphalt used on this project will cover 1,820m² over the 345 metre length. This is around 6 kilograms of rubber per tonne of asphalt or 90 truck tyres saved from landfill!

Progress at Pepi's

Road works at the entrance to the Emerald Netball Club, Pepi's Land, Emerald, will improve access, widen Beaconsfield Emerald Road and include a right-turn lane and left-turn slip lane into the entrance of the new pavilion. Funded by Council and the Australian Government.



Blackspot project: Avon Road, Avonsleigh

Blackspot works have been completed in Avon Road, Avonsleigh, between Kennedy Road and Woori Yallock Road. Works included shoulder sealing, guard rail installation, and line marking. Funded by the national Blackspot Program.



Surface works for sealed sections

Upcoming surface works on sealed roads include:

- Hein Road (Pakenham Upper)
- Pitt Road (Iona)
- McDonalds Track (Lang Lang)
- Railway Avenue (Tynong)

More than 100 road segments will be resealed or be overlaid with asphalt. Works on Lakeside Drive (Emerald) and Soldiers Road (Caldermeade and Lang Lange) have started. Works are funded by Council and the Australian Government's Roads to Recovery Program.




