School children from 25 schools across Cardinia Shire are gearing up to celebrate Koorie culture with their Koorie classmates at a special event.

The cultural celebration is an annual event usually held during NAIDOC week, however a new date on 15 September has been chosen to demonstrate that we can highlight the rich culture of our First Nations People at any time.

Henty Ward Councillor Carol Ryan was invited to chat with Pakenham school children Isabelle (Year 5), Kaelan (Year 3), Harvey (Year 2), Savannah (Year 2) and Sienna (Year 4), about their plans for the big day.

“The cultural event will be a great opportunity for Koorie children and young people across the district to connect with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture,” she said.

“It was lovely to hear firsthand from the children about what they’re most looking forward to about the event – no prizes for guessing that it was the games!”

Department of Education’s Koorie Engagement Team, in collaboration with Council’s Youth Services and Community Strengthening teams, will be hosting the shire-wide event.

The term Koorie is used inclusively and refers to both Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people living in Victoria.

The kids can expect art activities, guest presenters, dancing and traditional games on the day, and lots of activities to take back to their schools to continue their growth and learning.

Creating greater access

Thanks to support from Council, seven projects totalling almost \$300,000 were delivered as part of the 2021/22 Access Upgrade program of works.

Some of the projects completed included:

- Carpark sealing at the Lang Lang Men's Shed
- A change table upgrade at Beaconsfield Kinder
- Accessible toilet upgrades at Perc Allison Reserve and Emerald Seniors
- A new accessible toilet at the Lang Lang RSL.

Council's Access Upgrade program aims to provide liveable spaces and reduce barriers to participation within the community.

Councillor Brett Owen, Member of the Cardinia Access and Inclusion Advisory Committee and Beacon Hills Ward Councillor, was delighted that the projects had been delivered.

"These upgrades will help to ensure the accessibility of Cardinia Shire for both residents and visitors," Cr Owen said.

“Participating fully in all aspects of life is the right of all, and these upgrades will be a welcome addition to the community.”

Check your parking permit

Victoria’s accessible (disabled) parking permit scheme is no longer administered by Council, so you will now need to apply directly through your doctor if you need to renew or require a new permit. Changes in the scheme criteria may impact your eligibility.

More than 70 grants have been awarded since 2019 to fund much-needed community projects with our Community Capital Works Grant Program.

Pakenham Hills Ward Councillor Jack Kowarzik checked out how one of the grants was being enjoyed when he was taken on a tour of the Hollins Children's Centre in Pakenham by some of the kids.

"It is great to see the children enjoying their shaded structure now they have a fun outdoor space to keep playing whilst sheltering from the sun," he said.

"Submitting your project ideas for a Community Capital Works Grant is a great opportunity to give facilities that much-needed upgrade, and to decide how the community facility you use needs to be improved."

The Community Capital Works Grants Program helps community groups upgrade community and recreational facilities to strengthen local community networks and support community wellbeing.

You could receive up to \$35,000 in funding for community and recreational facility upgrade works.

Grants program announcement!

We're excited to announce that on behalf of the community we are providing more than \$60,000 in grants to community groups across Cardinia Shire, including:

- \$30,646.91 awarded for 7 seeding grants to support the cost of starting a new organisation, group, club, program, project, or service.
- \$12,413.20 awarded for 6 volunteering grants to help create volunteering programs, train volunteers, or promote volunteering opportunities.
- \$17,582.50 awarded for 21 small change grants to assist with a range of ad hoc costs that cannot be met through other funding sources, such as buying small items of equipment, website redevelopment, Christmas decorations and more.

The grants are part of Council's 2022–2023 Community Wellbeing Support Grants Program, which aim to support volunteers, and improve health and wellbeing.

Council is also supporting 48 festivals and events in 2022–23 as part of Council's Festivals and Events Grants Program.

We are providing more than \$230,595 in grants to not-for-profit, community-run festival and event organisers and

RSL clubs. These grants will help cover the costs of running local events such as community, arts and cultural festivals and events, as well as agricultural shows and major events.

This funding includes grants previously approved in the 2020-21 and 2021-22 Festival and Events Grants programs for events that had to be postponed due to COVID-19.

Beautify our community

Community groups and individuals can apply for dollar-for-dollar grants of up to \$2,000 for landscape enhancement projects that help the community beautify their local public open spaces.

Applications open 5 September.

Critter craft

Did you get a chance to wriggle on down to the worm farm workshop at Pakenham Library? If not, you can create your own mini worm farm at home to learn more about these amazing creatures and how they can help reduce your food waste.

You can create this DIY worm farm using recycled materials to house all of your new soil-mates.

Grab your supplies:

- a small plastic bottle and a large one
- a few handfuls of soil
- a few handfuls of sand
- a few handfuls of leaves
- a scrap of fabric or mesh
- a rubber band
- a dark piece of paper
- and some worms!

Step 1: Prepare your bottles! Rinse them and remove any labels, then you can cut the tops off the bottles **adults only**

Step 2: Pop the smaller bottle upside down inside the large bottle

Step 3: Now scatter the soil, sand and leaves in alternate layers around the small bottle inside the large bottle

Step 4: Now you can add your new wormy friends to the bottle! Just put them on the top layer and let them dig down into their new home

Step 5: Pop your scrap fabric or mesh over the top to act as a roof, and secure this with the rubber band

Step 6: Your new friends like to hang out in the dark, so wrap your dark piece of paper around the bottle like a jacket! You can remove this at any time to see how your worms are wriggling

Step 7: Now you have your own mini worm farm! Feed your little friends with a few fruit or veggie scraps (no citrus or onion) and a touch of water every so often to keep the soil slightly moist, and make sure they're kept in a cool place. After a few weeks when you're finished observing your worms, add the mixture back to your garden so the worms can help the plants grow.
