FREE COVID RATs for residents

Council has partnered with the Victorian Government to give out **FREE Rapid Antigen Tests** (RATs) to ensure that all residents in Cardinia Shire have access to safe COVID testing.

Residents are eligible to collect up to 2 packs of 5 RATs per person, and 2 packs per household member.

The RATs are available to collect from Council's Civic Centre, 20 Siding

Avenue Officer during opening hours, while stocks last.

Before making the trip, visit our website to check whether stock is still available.

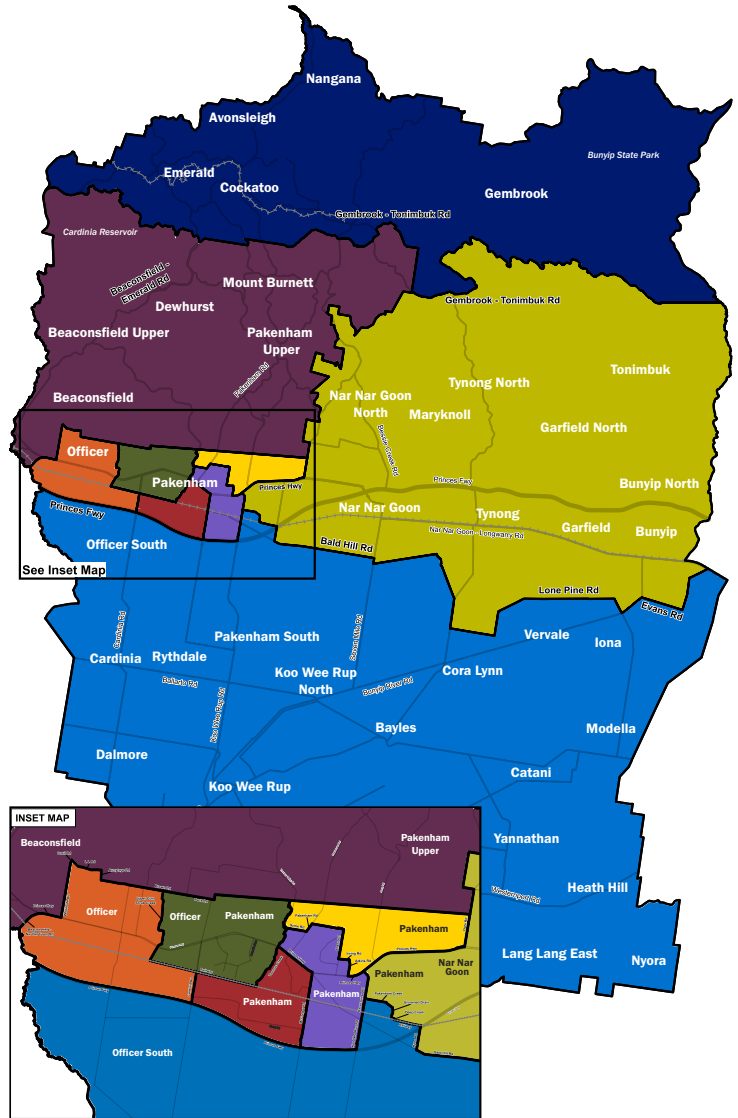

A win for cricketers

The Catani cricket nets have been upgraded and are now available for the community to use.

The upgrade includes a 4-lane enclosed cricket net and 4 synthetic wickets. The wickets feature a dividing wall and 2 retractable nets with rubber padding at the batter end.

Jointly funded by Council and the Victorian Government's Community Cricket Program, the upgrades will support more participation opportunities and hopefully encourage new members to join the Catani Cricket Club.

Westernport Ward Councillor Kaye Cameron said the new cricket facility was exciting for Catani and for the wider sporting community.

"There has been a need for some time now for the facilities at the cricket ground to be refreshed, and I'm looking forward to seeing the community make good use of the new nets," Cr Cameron said.

Grants up for grabs

Council has a range of grants on offer to support community projects, events and initiatives that boost the wellbeing of those who live and work in Cardinia Shire. Beacon Hills Ward Councillor Brett Owen is pleased that Council is able to offer so many different grants to the community.

"Whether you're looking to organise a community festival or beautify an outdoor space, you may well be able to deliver your initiative with the help of a Council grant," he said.

Arts and culture grants

Artists and arts groups can apply for a grant of up to \$5,000 for initiatives that expand and promote the arts in Cardinia Shire.

Applications open from March.

Community capital works grant

These grants are available in 3 categories:

- Up to \$20,000 for upgrade works on community and recreational facilities that are managed by community groups on Council's behalf. Council coordinates all works.
- Dollar-for-dollar funding of up to \$35,000 to help community groups to upgrade public facilities on Council-owned or Crown land.
- Dollar-for-dollar funding of up to \$20,000 available to community

groups to purchase major equipment that is used to undertake approved maintenance activities at sporting grounds, outer grounds or large internal areas.

Applications are now open, and close 31 March.

Community wellbeing and support grants

These grants help establish new organisations, projects and services. Funding categories include:

- small change grants (up to \$1,000)
- volunteering grants (up to \$3,000)
- seeding grants (up to \$5,000)

Applications are now open, and close 31 March.

Festival and events grants

Grants up to \$10,000 are available to help stage not-for-profit, community-run festivals and events.

Applications are now open, and close 31 March.

Heritage grants

Grants are available to help repair or conserve places and sites of heritage significance, including those that are part of a commercial or residential heritage precinct. Grants are funded dollar-for-dollar to a maximum of \$5000.

Applications open from May.

Weed control grants

These grants help fund weed control work on private property of high environmental or agricultural significance in Cardinia Shire. They're available to residents (up to \$350) and community groups (up to \$750).

Applications are now open and close 31 May.

Our mission is zero emissions

We're on track to reduce Council's greenhouse gas emissions by around 5,500 tonnes of CO₂e (carbon dioxide equivalent) and dramatically reduce electricity costs this financial year!

Cardinia Shire Council is one of 51 Victorian councils to have slashed its energy bills and reduced emissions through the Victorian Energy Collaboration (VECO), a joint renewable energy contract.

Toomuc Ward Councillor and delegate for South East Councils Climate Change Alliance (SECCCA), Councillor Stephanie Davies, was pleased that these savings will go towards helping our community.

"Partnering with VECO has already seen huge savings for Cardinia Shire, and these savings can now be directed to the critical community services that Council provides, such as roads and

parks maintenance, which will benefit our residents," she said.

"Renewable energy is essential to achieving our goal of net zero Council emissions by 2024, and the partnership with VECO is a great step towards this."

Lighting the way

The first stage of Council's street lighting upgrade has been completed!

Almost 850 mercury vapour street lights across the shire have been replaced with energy efficient LEDs as part of the upgrades.

Replacing these lights with new technology will save about \$64,000 each year in energy and maintenance costs.

The new LED lights perform better, last longer, generate less glare and are up to 86 per cent more efficient than the old lights.

Maintaining public lighting is just one way Council helps to make our community safer, as outlined in our Cardinia Safer Communities Strategy.

The lighting upgrade is being funded by Council, AusNet Services and the Australian Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure program.

Caring for our critters

Three solar powered wildlife-sensitive lights have been installed along McGregor and Soldiers roads in Rythdale.

Using warm, amber-coloured lights with reduced blue-white light, this lighting has been found to encourage more natural sleeping, feeding, growth, behaviour and reproduction patterns in wildlife.

Installed as part of a trial, the 3000k solar lighting aims to enhance natural habitats and help boost numbers of local native wildlife, including wallabies, the Crescent Honeyeater, echidnas, Gould's wattle bat and the Australian Painted Lady Butterfly.

"Clean Up Australia Day is always a great community event to help look after our local environment – and it's wonderful that residents can register all year," he said.

Council is always looking at smarter ways to manage waste for our community. We're taking steps to help residents reduce the amount of waste Cardinia Shire sends to landfill in several ways, including exploring new technologies.

Use your garden bin for food waste, order a smaller landfill bin for a discounted rate, keep an eye out for our community workshops and events, and get money back when you improve your own resource recovery by buying a compost bin, worm farm, mulcher, reusable nappies, or sanitary and incontinence products.

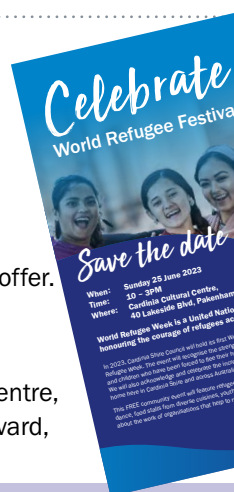

'Planty' of free trees!

Our annual FREE native plant giveaway is here!

We're partnering with the Cardinia Environment Coalition Nursery to give away 5 free native plants to the first 320 Cardinia Shire households to take up the offer.

Plants are available from 9am to noon on Fridays at Cardinia Environment Coalition Nursery, Deep Creek Reserve (62 Cameron Way, Pakenham) until Friday 30 June, or while stock lasts.

We're also inviting schools, kindergartens, community groups and owners of properties more than 4000 square metres to apply for a native plant voucher, which gives them \$50 towards native plants from the Cardinia Environment Coalition Nursery.

There are only a limited number of vouchers, so get in quick! Applications open 9am on Monday 6 March,

until stocks last. Apply for your voucher online at

www.cardinia.vic.gov.au/freeplants

Proof of residency is required.

Voucher holders can choose from a selection of indigenous trees, shrubs and grasses as tube stock. Plants can be collected from the nursery once vouchers have been issued.

Bunyip Ward Councillor Graeme Moore encourages more residents to consider planting native plants on their properties.

"Native plants are important to preserve local biodiversity and encourage more native animals to visit our gardens," he said.

"Head to the Cardinia Environment Coalition Nursery and snap up some wonderful native plants. Why not even make a day of it and enjoy a day out at Deep Creek Reserve?"

Emerald Lake Park-ing

Planning on taking a trip to Emerald Lake Park? Did you know that annual parking passes are available for Cardinia Shire residents?

Parking passes cost \$10 for unlimited parking, and are available each year from 31 August for 12 months. New passes must be purchased each year.

Lend a hand with storm recovery



Calling all volunteers to lend a hand with the clean-up of the June 2021 storms!

This severe weather event caused considerable damage in some parts of our shire, and several of our residents are still in need of help with moving storm debris from their properties.

Working with a team of other generous residents, you would be rolling up your sleeves to help with tasks including clearing storm debris, splitting and stacking wood using an automatic wood splitter, and repairing fences.

Council has been working in partnership with Habitat for Humanity Australia, Yarra

Ranges Council and Treasuring Our Trees to continue to support local communities affected by the storms, with help from Victorian Government funding.

Volunteer days run from 9am until 3.30pm on weekdays and weekends and will continue until May.

Install a rainwater tank

Rainwater tanks collect stormwater run-off from roofs, reducing the amount that enters our waterways. When installed correctly and safely, they can even be used to flush toilets and water gardens, which helps reduce your water bills.



Raingardens

Raingardens are self-watering and low-maintenance gardens that capture rainwater and filter it using plants.

Create swales in your garden

A swale is a small channel that can help slow down and direct water into the soil.

It's pet registration time

All dogs and cats over the age of 3 months must be registered with Council before 10 April. If you register your pet before this age, and provide written proof of their date of birth, registration is free for the first year!

If you've registered your pet with us before, you'll get a renewal notice in the mail before your registration is due.

Your pet needs to be microchipped before it's registered. Cats also need to be desexed, and if your dog is desexed you'll pay a reduced fee.

Registration fees go towards off-leash dog areas, collecting and returning lost pets, following up complaints about problem dogs and cats, and investigating dog attacks.

Cats to stay home

All cats in Cardinia Shire must be confined to their own property at all times.

This helps to protect native wildlife, reduce the feral cat population, reduce the spread of disease and keep your furry friend safe.

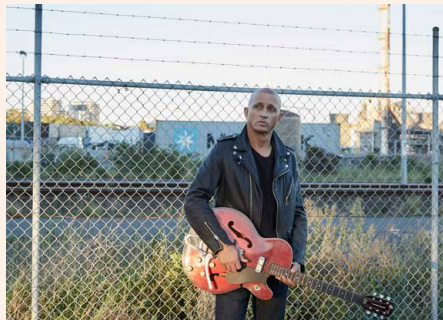
