

Following an extensive consultation process with the community, Council's budget for this financial year has been endorsed.

Here are some of the key areas we're focusing on delivering for Cardinia Shire this year:

\$13.3m for recreation, leisure, and community facilities

\$2.2m for drains and bridges

\$3.4m for parks, open space, and streetscapes

\$30.4m for property (including construction and upgrades of buildings)

\$1.4m for footpaths and cycleways

\$59m budgeted for all roads and intersection upgrade programs

(including road maintenance and fixing potholes)

\$4.1m for plant, equipment and lighting

Delegate for the audit committee, Deputy Mayor and Pakenham Hills Ward Councillor Jack Kowarzik expressed his gratitude to everyone who took part in the budget consultation. "Community members made 286 submissions during the budget development and consultation process, which took place from December 2022 to May 2023," Cr Kowarzik said.

"This is an amazing response, and every piece of feedback was considered as part of the process. It's a budget we can all be proud of, and I know that it will achieve many great outcomes for the shire."

1st instalment - 30 September 2023 2nd instalment - 30 November 2023 3rd instalment - 28 February 2024 4th instalment - 31 May 2024

If you choose to pay your rates in full, we suggest making this payment by 30 September 2023 in line with the first instalment date to avoid any late payment charges.

We know that it may be difficult to meet instalment deadlines. Because of this, Council offers a variety of payment plan options which can help with scheduling your rates payments.

Recently launched, the MyCardinia portal allows you to create a unique login then sign in to do a range of tasks online – whenever it suits you.

"The MyCardinia portal is designed to make it easy and secure for our residents to make some of their most frequent Council payments and applications online, as well as track the status of their requests," Cr Davies said.

"We know how full peoples' lives are and we hope this great new portal allows them to 'do business' with Council at a time and place that works for them – whether it's on the train on the way to work or sitting on the couch at home!"

Some of the tasks you can do online using MyCardinia include:

- registering your pets and paying registration renewal fees
- reporting an issue or requesting services, then tracking the progress of your request
- making rates payments and verifying your properties
- · registering your pool
- submitting a report and consent application for siting variation and flooding
- · paying a fine.

Creating a more sustainable shire

Three much-loved community facilities have been given new sustainability upgrades!

The Beaconsfield Community Complex, Bunyip Hall and Koo Wee Rup Community Centre each received sustainability upgrades which will help reduce energy and water costs.

Thanks to a Council Community Capital Works grant, two 10 kilowatt solar energy systems have been installed at Bunyip Hall and Koo Wee Rup Community

Centre, which are estimated to reduce energy costs for each building by \$2,000 per year.

The Beaconsfield Community Complex has received a new rainwater harvesting system, which will enable rainwater to be used for irrigation and toilet flushing.

During construction, Beacon Hills Ward Councillor Brett Owen was invited to check out the progress of the rainwater harvesting system at the complex.

"It's great to see more sustainable initiatives in the shire," Cr Owen said.

"By 2024 our goal is to achieve net zero Council emissions, and each sustainability upgrade that we make is helping us to meet that target."

Better and brighter tennis courts are now open in Cockatoo at Alma Treloar Reserve, providing more opportunities for players to hone their skills day or night. The courts in Cockatoo now have two new safer, synthetic grass surfaces, new lighting and fencing, and wider accessible entry points. This project was jointly funded by Council and the Victorian Government's 2021-22 Local Sports Facilities Fund - Community Facilities.

Kurmboon Child and Family Centre is now open and delivering high quality kindergarten services to 3-and-4-yearold children and their families!

Located in Officer, the centre features 2 kindergarten program rooms, a community room, 3 consulting rooms, a public art piece, and more.

Mayor Councillor Tammy Radford recently opened the new centre with Minister for Early Childhood and Pre-Prep Ingrid Stitt MLC, along with Member for Pakenham Emma Vulin MP.

"Kurmboon Child and Family Centre offers state-of-the-art spaces for the local community to access the early years and family services they need," Mayor Radford said.

"Our data shows that an average of 3 families are moving into our community each day, so we need to keep advocating for more funding for critical infrastructure and family services to support our residents."

This project was funded by the Victorian Government's Children's Facilities Capital Program Major Grants and Council via developer contributions.

Funding has also been announced for construction of a new integrated child and family centre – with an interim name of Thewlis Road Integrated Child and Family Centre – to be built in north west Pakenham to meet the needs of families in Cardinia Shire's growth corridor.

Creating a day and night-time destination

In the coming months and into 2024, you'll start to see some exciting changes.

- September 2023: Council will engage a project partner to deliver Stage 1 works, a detailed plan will be shared with the community
- January 2024: Stage 1 (Part 1) Main Street Central works will take place
- September 2024: Stage 1 (Part 2)
 Main Street Gateway works will take place. You'll see:
 - New parallel parking bays
 - More space for streetscape improvements including wider pedestrian areas, new seating and street furniture.
 - Four on-street accessible parking bays will be located at the centre of Main Street.

An additional three public toilets will be delivered, bringing the number of toilets within a 500m radius of the town centre from 2 to 5.

Future engagement

With remaining stages planned to be delivered across the next 10 years, we'll continue to work with our community to ensure we are building a Pakenham to be proud of.

Thanks to passionate young environmentalists at Koo Wee Rup Primary School, we're one step closer to safeguarding the future of the endangered Southern Brown Bandicoot!

Since 2020, 500 indigenous plants have been planted on the schoolgrounds which now form a special habitat for local bandicoots.

Students undertook the plantings with the assistance of Westernport Biosphere Foundation and the Cranbourne Botanical Gardens, and funding from Council.

Throughout the journey, Koo Wee Rup Primary School students learned about conservation and the importance of looking out for endangered animals.

Westernport Ward Councillor Kaye Cameron loved the opportunity to be taken on a tour of the new bandicoot garden.

"Koo Wee Rup Primary School have done a fantastic job in creating this bandicoot haven. They should be very proud of their excellent efforts," Cr Cameron said.

"The school have also generously allowed Council to set up future timelapse cameras to try and capture footage of the bandicoots as they begin to explore the space – we can't wait to see them!"

Protecting our nosey neighbours

Watch out, there could be a bandicoot about! Here are some tips that you can try to create a safe environment for any Southern Brown Bandicoots that might visit your neighbourhood.

- Keep your cat inside and your dog on a leash. This not only helps protect bandicoots, but also other animals and people - as well as your pet.
- Plant low, dense native plants on your property. Mat-rushes, tussock-grasses, and grass-trees provide good nest spots for bandicoots.
- Tell us where you see them! Log a sighting on the iNaturalist app.

Having somewhere to hide is very important for bandicoots – they need places to sleep, raise young, and stay hidden if predators like cats and foxes are around.

Want a small challenge? Sections of terracotta pipe can be quite popular with bandicoots as a spot to snooze.

Want a medium challenge? You can plant a bandicoot garden. Bandicoots like to nest under big strappy plants, so grasses and low-growing grass trees are great.

With thousands of dogs registered in Cardinia Shire, there's lots of love for our canine companions – but are you doing everything possible to keep your pets safe?

Bunyip Ward Councillor Graeme Moore and his dog, Lucy, met up with Jen from Council's Regulatory Services team and her pooches to brush-up on tips to help keep pets safe.

"I'm a proud pet-parent, and keeping my dog safe both at home and on walks is very important," said Cr Moore. "Keeping pets under control protects the whole community – our pets, our environment, and each other."

Please report any issues with dogs to Council, including; a dog attack, excessive barking, dogs wandering, or issues with dangerous or restricted breed dogs.

Here are 4 things to keep in mind if you have a dog at home:

- All dogs must be kept contained to their owner's property in Cardinia Shire. This means your yard must be enclosed with a fence high enough that your dog can't jump over or get through
- Dogs must be kept on a leash when in a public place, except if in a designated off-leash dog area
- If your dog wanders off from your property, you may be given an official warning or a fine. If we're unable to reconnect you, wandering dogs may be taken to the pound
- If your dog rushes at or chases someone, you could be fined or taken to court, and we may have to declare your dog to be a 'menacing dog', meaning your pet may need to be muzzled when out in public.

"The drop-off event is a convenient way for residents to have a good clear-out of any unwanted textiles, and help avoid more waste heading to landfill," Cr Ross said.

"This service isn't offered in many places, so I would encourage residents to head down to the event with their pre-loved textiles."

All textiles including clothing and household linen that are too damaged for donation will be accepted for specialised fibre-to-fabric recycling.

Emergencies can come in many forms, such as bushfires and floods, and often happen when we least expect them. The better prepared we are before an emergency can help us to bounce back after.

When an emergency occurs, it can be hard to stay calm and remember the things that you need, so we've developed Ready Get Go bags along with emergency preparedness kits specially designed to help you prepare for emergencies before they happen.

The bags are lightweight and easy to use, and full of helpful resources, including an Emergency Plan template and a checklist of things you might need if you have to leave your home in a hurry during an emergency.

Developing your own emergency plan can help prepare and protect you, your family and your pets in emergency situations. Council is proud to have worked with Officer Specialist School in putting together Ready Get Go bags with additional resources for vulnerable members of our community.
