Executive Summary

As part of the reporting process to Council, this monthly report provides an update of the status of major projects in progress.

Materials, supply and logistics impacts on project delivery

Project managers have worked closely with contractors and suppliers over the past 12-24 months to attempt to minimise the impact of the volatile post-covid labour and materials market. This has proven to be particularly successful in the civil construction space, where the use of a contractor panel and pre-ordering of critical supplies (eg. precast concrete pipes) has resulted in reduced delays and, in some cases, fast tracking of works, resulting in a higher capital works spend then would otherwise have been achievable.

Cost escalations continue to be an issue, particularly in the building construction space, as well as the availability of contractors. This continues to cause low response rates for public tenders and non-competitive tender submissions increasing financial risk.

Cora Lynn Recreation Reserve - change room pavilion upgrade

McGregor-Soldiers-Hobson roads

Princes Highway intersection upgrades

Eight intersections along the Princess Highway between Beaconsfield and Pakenham have been identified for upgrading through the associated planning schemes. Upgrades identified include amendments to two existing signalised intersections as well as signalising six previously unsignalised intersections. All intersections have been highlighted for additional or extended turn lanes, additional through lanes, bus priority lanes, and shared cycle/pedestrian lanes.

Bayview Road, Officer

| Project description | Bayview Road Princes Highway intersection is currently an unsignalised T-intersection. This project will: upgrade the intersection to be a fully signalised crossroad, with the southern leg of Bayview Road being constructed and connecting into the development to the southwest. Ultimately this southern leg will connect to the Monash Freeway via the Officer South Road interchange. include dual right turn lanes into both legs of Bayview Road, a westbound bus priority lane, off road cycle and pedestrian paths, and car parking alterations along the Princes Highway eastbound lane |
|---------------------|---|
| Funding | This project is jointly funded by Developer Contributions and the Australian Government |
| Timing | Scheduled to be complete by end of October 2023 |
| Update | Pavement works on the Princes Highway, as well as public lighting, and signal installation works are continuing. |

Tivendale Road, Officer

| Project description | The Tivendale Road/Station Street Princes Highway intersection is an existing fully signalised intersection. The upgrade works will increase the capacity of the intersection to handle the increased traffic volumes caused by adjacent development. This includes constructing duel right turn lanes into and exiting Tivendale Road, a westbound bus priority lane, off road cycle and pedestrian paths, and car parking alterations along the Princes Highway eastbound lanes and the southern service road. |

Brunt Road, Officer

| Project description | The Brunt Road/Whiteside Road Princes Highway intersection is an existing fully signalised intersection. The upgrade works will increase the capacity of the intersection to handle the increased traffic volumes caused by adjacent development. This includes constructing duel right turn lanes into and exiting both Brunt Road and Whiteside Road, a westbound bus priority lane and off-road cycle and pedestrian paths. |

Sealing the Hills program

The advocacy campaign calling on the Australian Government to reconsider the decision to discontinue the project is ongoing.

An Australian Government budget submission has been prepared and was submitted in February calling for the reinstatement of funding or extended funding however no official response has been received by either Council.

The partition to parliament was tabled at parliament with the responsible minister responding to the community in April indicating that no further funding will be received.

The Victorian Government has also been approached to seek additional funding to continue the program.
